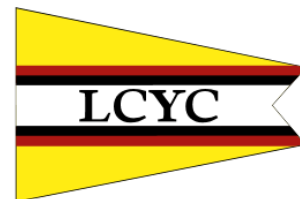

know she's a great cook so it will be good! The outgoing board of governors will host the breakfast the next morning, so be sure to drop by, have some food, and thank them for all their hard work over the past 2 years. Surely you will be hungry again by the middle of December.

By the time you read this I hope you will have attended the annual meeting and dinner at the Fair Oaks Country Club. It should be a lot of fun.

Many people asked for the chicken salad recipe served for Sunday lunches at WurstFest both weekends. There isn't a recipe in the sense of telling you exactly how much of the ingredients to use, since everything is added to taste, but I will share the secrets.

### McGill Chicken Salad

To whatever amount of cooked chicken you have, add some finely chopped onion (I don't want to overpower the salad with onion so I used very little, about 1/4-1/2 onion to a whole chicken), chopped celery (again, to your taste - I want a little celery in each bite, but no bites with only celery, so use maybe 3 or 4 ribs with a whole chicken). Add chopped toasted nuts and Craisins in about the same proportion as onion and celery, maybe 1/2 cup of each for a chicken. I've used almonds and pecans and both are good. Roasted, salted almonds from Sam's were used in the salad served for WurstFest. Last year the chicken salad was a spur of the moment decision to use leftover chicken breasts and there were no Craisins at the club so we used sweet pickle relish. That was good too, but I like the color that the Craisins add. The point is to add something sweet, and that's one of the secrets. Now, for the real secrets:

1. Put in enough real mayonnaise to make it all stick together to your taste. The mayonnaise will soak into the ingredients, so it will seem drier if you make it ahead of time and you may need to add more. You'll probably use at least 1/2-3/4 cup of mayo for a whole chicken.
2. Salt and black pepper to taste. You will use a LOT more pepper than you think, but that is the real secret of the chicken salad. Don't try to put it in all at once, but you may use a couple of teaspoons to a tablespoon for a whole chicken, depending on the pepper and your taste.
3. The chicken can be cooked any way you want. Rotisserie chicken from the store makes good salad and is easy. I have boiled or roasted whole chickens or breasts only seasoned with salt and pepper. For WurstFest, we used chicken that had been marinated in Italian salad dressing and then smoked on the grill with the sausage. I'm not crazy about canned chicken, but some people use it.
4. Now you know the secrets and you don't need me to make your chicken salad.

## Wurstfest Regatta

**Nov 4 – 6 and Nov 11 – 13, 2011**

Wurstfest regatta 43 is now a memory and I have to say that it will be an unforgettable memory for Mo and me. Why? Was it because the winds were exceptional and the racing was challenging? Was it because we had an

exceptional turn out with more boats on the water than usual? Was it because the food served was superb and the entertainment was outstanding? Yes, Yes, and Yes to all these reasons and more, but the most unforgettable memory for me was how all of the LCYC volunteered stood together to deliver an outstanding regatta for all of our guests to enjoy; how everyone took their job as a personal commitment. Over 100 volunteer positions were filled each weekend and some volunteers took on multiple positions. If each volunteer position was only a four hour shift, then a total of 4000 man-hours were contributed to make Wurstfest 43 happen; this is two man years of work each weekend! Many shifts were far more than four hours; race committee jobs were more like 8 to 10 hours over two days.

Personal commitments of this magnitude come about because of outstanding leadership. Not mine, but the leadership of the three main committee chairs who ran Wurstfest like a well-oiled machine. Commodore Ray Leubner commanded the on water race activities like it was a destroyer squadron. Plans were made well ahead of time, experienced Pros were chosen, lines of communication were established, and the races were executed with precision. The race PROs who need to be recognized are Chuck Begley, Bubba Horner (Twice), Barry Parkoff, Bob Middleton, Henry McGill, and Rodger Poe. The kitchen activities were executed with the same military like precision by Luzia and Wayne Weston. Each meal was led by an experienced chef who planned the menu, purchased the food, solicited their volunteers who prepared the food and cleaned up afterwards. Our chefs for WFR 43 were Terry Tomko — breakfast, Margaret McGill – Lunch, Luzia and Wayne — Dinner, and Mo — Friday night. The “On-Shore” activities, organized by Rear Commodore David Bray, are less visible but none the less essential. These activities include the all-important Registration led by Kathy Leubner, Launch and Retrieval traffic control led by Bob Wickman and Richard Reyes, the raffle which made almost \$4000 for our sailing foundation was organized by Jean Prados. Lots of folks put in a lot of individual hours; two that I noticed who were at the club almost constantly were Kathy Leubner and Carolyn Harris...thank you ladies and thanks to all for making Wurstfest Regatta 43 the best function that I have ever been a part of.

Lastly I would like to thank our sponsors who provide significant support for our regatta. UBS who make significant cash contribution, Kiolbasa Provisions Co for their generous donation of sausages, Roeschmann Design for the creative graphic art for our unique T-shirt image provided gratis, Adelitas Tortillas for their contribution of tamales, tortillas, and chips, and Subway for their discount contribution, and we now have a beer sponsor- Tri City distributor, LP.

Now for a few fun facts about WFR 43...We had 89 boats register the first weekend and 76 the second; of these, 25% were from LCYC. But most important, LCYC won 30% of the trophies! A great improvement over years past (20% last year); it would seem that some have listened to advice

to practice more and polish the bottom of your boat. Eighteen different clubs were represented at WFR 43 the first weekend and 25 clubs the second. The longest distance traveled was 490 NM by Robert Miller from El Paso; the shortest distance was Zero NM by Dave Sanford. The youngest sailor was Brandon Cassard from LCYC and the oldest was Marilyn Boemer 79 out of Grapevine; there were 7 old goats older than me sailing over both weekends, two were in a Sunfish.

## Race Committee

### Wurstfest I

With a near perfect wind for Sunfish, 160 degrees at 18-22 mph with higher gusts, first race started count down at 11:30 AM.

Had clean starts for all 5 races over next two days.

Chase boat # 1 manned by Tom Geis and Mark Hudson, using Mark's boat. They took care of windward mark and offset mark. Did great job, as they picked up significant persistent 20 degree wind during second race and Chase boat #2 at leeward mark placed new course bearing on large board with 140 on it to signal direction to new windward mark. Also flew Charlie flag with repeated sound signals before first boat reached leeward mark. Chase #2 boat was Carl Hendrickson's pontoon boat with help from Carl Hawkins and Scott Wells. Carl was also responsible for start-finish line and did great job of squaring line.

Actually moved starting ball closer to RC boat after all boats had started. After first race, a few Fish dropped out for second and third race so not necessary to shorten finish line. Quite a few capsized, but all recovered safely. Flew H flag before 1st place boat finished and left it up until last boat finished. Majority felt like they had enough racing for the day of fairly high winds so sent everybody home.

Windward leg 0.75NM in length and a 4, making course 3 NM.

Sunday, winds only 6-10 mph. Direction more East at 090-120 degrees.

Tom and Mark in Chase boat #1, set mark at 110 degrees and 0.6NM length of windward leg. Fleet given a 4, so total distance was 2.4 NM.

Fish like races to last around 45-50 minutes, that is why course was slightly shorter today. By time all boats complete course and finish and start the 5 minute start routine, takes at least one hour+ to run each race. As a long time custom for Sunfish at Wurstfest Regatta, the winner of each race receives a shotgun blast and the spent cartridge with race #, their name and Wurstfest Regatta permanently printed on it. Hank Saurage from Baton Rouge, LA had 4 first place cartridges. Our own Dave Sanford won race #4, so he also received a cartridge. Way to go Dave!

RC boat manned by Wayne Eckstine, Bob Taylor, Lee Woodbury, Dan Hollingsworth, and Bubba Horner.

Great time had by all sailors. Three of our Sunfish sailors from LCYC trophied:

- Dave Sanford 3rd place overall with one bullet.
- Chris Besch 6th place overall with a 2nd place in last race.
- Chris Harkins 1st place Sunfish Jrs.

At trophy presentation, Ash Beatty presented the Texas Sunfish Circuit Championship Perpetual Trophy that is kept in our club house. It was won this year by living legend, Paul Foerster, who won all circuit regattas he attended. Paul was also in three Olympics. Won a Gold and 2 Silver medals in sailing.

He recently won 2nd place in Sunfish at the PanAm Games, held at Puerto Vallarta, Mexico.

### Wurstfest II

How blessed we were to have both weekends of Wurstfest with near perfect winds. Wurstfest 2, our team was assigned to PHRF course, which was located near dam. Took advantage because was in position to use largest part of lake, by setting up windward mark towards deep cove across lake. Advised Dave Sanford only on length of course, 0.8 Nautical Mile, and always let him set it in degrees of wind. RC boat is anchored and does not get as accurate wind readings as Chase boat floating free.

Also, Chase boat is receiving wind first and is constantly monitoring wind in both strength and direction. I have been truly blessed with outstanding Chase boat operators: Dave Sanford, Wayne Eckstine, Bob Middleton, Tom Geis, Mark Hudson, Carl Hendrickson, and many others who are really good at obtaining a mean average for wind direction.

Tom and Mark picked up a persistent 20 degree wind shift that held rest of afternoon. Only time we moved windward mark was during Sunfish Regatta.

Did not have to move any mark during PHRF Regatta. Because of using tetrahedrons, had some dragging of marks due to heavy air. Really wasn't as strong as Wurstfest I weekend, but used round buoys, which wind has no flat side to drag marks, during Wurstfest I, Sunfish Regatta.
